Operations and Facilities – *Wayne Discussion of trees on north boundary*

Our guest, Jane Groppenberger was concerned by the pruning/cutting of trees without notification. She would like the board to discuss pruning/cutting of *any* trees. Furthermore, Jane would like Jeanne involved so they can plant additional trees such as Mt. Hemlock, Rhododendrons with additional plants when the work is done. In the future the Committee Chair in charge of landscaping (now Jeanne) with Jane will collaborate with Wayne (Committe Chair of operations) before cutting so that landscaping can be addressed.

It was decided that Liane would check her records to find out who the original donor was for the Gem Car. Contact would be made to find out if they would like it returned. Ed and Rick will collaborate on this. If the original donors do not wish to have it then AIHS could put it up for sale or donate appropriately.

Farmhouse Status

The Farmhouse Attic has been cleaned out. Wayne will look into having new insulation blown into the attic.

The insulation found in Coop 2 will be used there.

The one window on the south side of the Farmhouse has been repaired. There are 2 other broken panes.

Wayne's List

- ? Sawmill in use, it needs new blades
- ? We are in the process of re-roofing three sheds. We have the materials needed. We have the three windows that need to be replaced in Coop 2, they will probably be installed during the Winter.
- The bathroom problem is gender specific. In the last year we have had 3-4 incidents of bathroom plugging all in the women's bathrooms. We are guessing this is a paper issue.
- The stage has a dozen boards that need to be flipped since they are scaling on the exposed side.
- A man fell off the stage steps and hurt his knee. I know how to stabilize the steps.
 I heard that a woman stumbled over a shut off-valve cover and we know how to fix that.
- There was a chair problem at the concert. There was much mis-communication. AIHS is in charge (Wayne and Jon). Island Arts should defer to them. It is agreed that Island Arts should pay Jon for the setup not AIHS.

Archival Building Report - Ed Stephenson

New Archival Building Annex (Rick & Ed)Building Status

Rick has been interfacing with Pierce County regarding the new Archival Building Annex and has managed to get them to agree on some parts. AIHS projected 15#sf for snow load and the County wants 30#sf. Rick and Ed went back to the builder - who went back to headquarters. They said they would do it but it would cost \$1100 more. They said the original bid was only for 30 days and wanted to rebid. Ed went back to the builder and stated that the down payment was to lock in the bid. Ed went back and forth with emails and they did agree we did NOT have to pay the \$1100. Now they want to run the analysis and we will only have 30 days. After that time period, if we haven't solved the issue with the County then they could increase the price a fair amount, at their discretion. We are stuck in the middle. This review should be done in about 4

a week. Once we have it, we will need to rely on Rick to go back to the county. Rick and Ed are stuck in the middle between the builder and the County!

Rick was asked about the original concrete road. It has not specifically been waived but considering the status change to "agricultural" the requirement should drop off.

Status: Archival Building as a museum – Dick Throm

Rick and Dick have a mutual agreement that the North section of the AB would be used for revolving exhibits. Display cases could be repositioned or moved to other locations on the farm as needed. It is agreed that displays will enhance the existing pictures and create repeated attendance.

Archives- Rick Anderson

Inventory/Cataloging Status Farmhouse Vision and Plan (Karen S)

2 items need to be purchased: a step ladder and generator. Vista Electric is gone from the Island for a while so Rick will try to make some other contacts for the generator.

Leanne Whitaker is working on the Pilot house.

Workers are being recruited to work on the two grain binders (1910 and 1920) Beau Barclay has bound copies of our Island Gazette. He is also scanning old photo contest pictures.

Bob and Rick are working on the first draft of the Movie about the farm. They are filming and patching more together. The trailer is available to show at the festival.

Bobi has offered to donate Kerry's family "collectible" typewriter and an ancient phone (could be set up in the farmhouse.) Rick will look at them to make the determination. Melissa could incorporate the typewriter into her display.
